



The Emily Dickinson Museum is happy to share with you this color by number activity sheet, specifically created in honor of Emily Dickinson's 190th birthday.

Here are some instructions that can help you to get started.

- 1. On the right corner of your print out you will see a list of colors 1–11 titled SUGGESTED COLORS. Please feel free to supplement these colors for any you feel would be more suited to your personal way of expressing yourself.
- 2. The colors on the right corner correspond with numbers throughout the printout. For example a number 7 can be seen at the top of the printout where Emily Dickinson's hair is drawn. As you may have already noticed number 7 corresponds to the color brown on our list.
- 3. The print out is divided in shapes. Within each shape is a number. Each number corresponds with a color. Use that corresponding color to fill in the shape. For example wherever you see the number 7, fill that entire shape in with the color brown (or a color of your choosing) and so on.
- 4. Continue to fill in all the numbered shapes with their color match and eventually, you will see your own personal masterpiece emerge!
- 5. One last piece of advice, give yourself the freedom to play with this image and do something uniquely you.
